

ALF AND ROLF BO TRUST



Alf Bo and his brother, Rolf, were life-long farmers and residents of Ramsey County in the Grand Harbor area. Sons of Norwegian immigrants Iver and Carrie Bo, Alf was born August 5, 1889, and Rolf was born November 14, 1900, both in North Dakota.

The two farmed a 1200-acre farm one mile west of the Six Mile Bay Bridge on Highway 19 and one mile left. They had a large herd of cattle and ran a good operation.

Alf and Rolf were members of Norway Lutheran Church, which is now part of the St. Olaf Retreat Center near Devils Lake. Rolf

preceded Alf in death in December of 1972.

Alf married Dolly Lamoreaux in 1965. Dolly preceded her husband in death on November 22, 1979. Alf passed away on June 5, 1985, in Bothell, Washington.

In 1985, Lake Region State College and the Devils Lake Area Foundation were pleased to become recipients of more than \$200,000 each from the Alf Bo Estate.

The Alf and Rolf Bo Trust was established for the college, and income from the trust is directed to support priority needs as identified by college administration. ●
