His first sales job was selling/delivering "The Grit," a weekly newspaper, and periodically selling greeting cards door to door in his elementary school years. In his high school years, Jeff spent two summers traveling with the Bill Dillard Carnival. The money he earned allowed him to buy his own clothes and bring home extra money to help his family. It also meant there was one less child to feed at home. He was very involved in the DECA program in high school. Jeff credits skills he learned from these early

business opportunities helped him succeed later in life. He prided himself in being the only one of his siblings to graduate from high school. Jeff was not afraid of a challenge, and never felt sorry for himself or his circumstances.

Upon graduation, Jeff attended then Lake Region Junior College; now Lake Region State College, with plans of becoming a policeman like his uncle. He also began employment as a salesman at Mark's Chevrolet in Cando, ND. It didn't take long for him to decide he could make more money and drive nice cars as a salesman. He later began employment with Lake Chevrolet in Devils Lake, ND.

Barb McDowell was born, and raised in New Rockford, ND. She graduated from UND and began employment at the Lake Region Youth Association as an assistant director in 1984. This is where the two met. Jeff was a very involved volunteer at the youth center. They married in 1986, making their home in Devils Lake, ND.
